**ISSUE #9 - HB 4256 - Relating to removing certain requirements from WV Jobs Act.**

**Description/Action:** Would weaken regulations surrounding contractors’ submissions of certified payrolls, documents vital to ensure local workers are employed on public construction projects and unauthorized workers aren’t being illegally brought in from out of state.

**Voting Body:** 25-member House Committee on Workforce Development – **The Vote: Did not pass**
