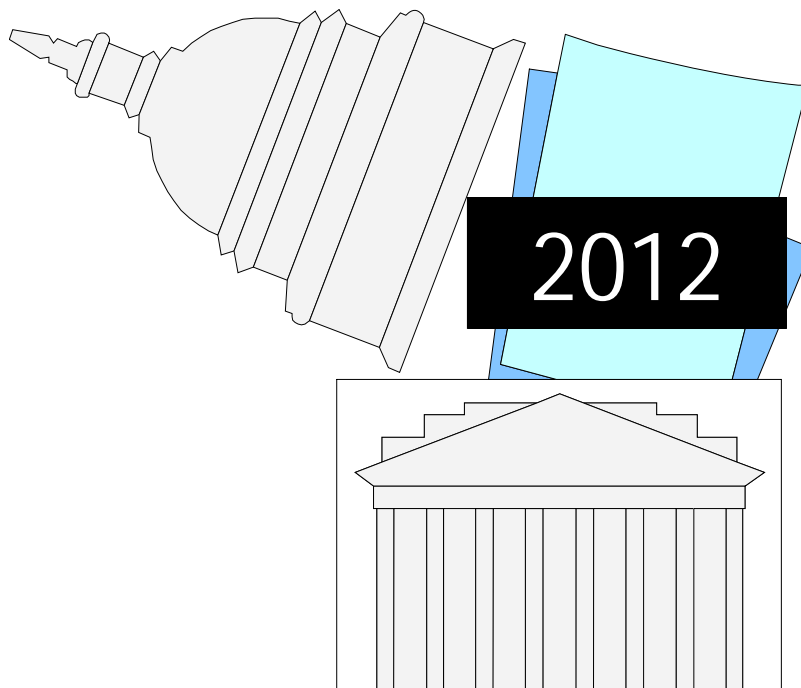

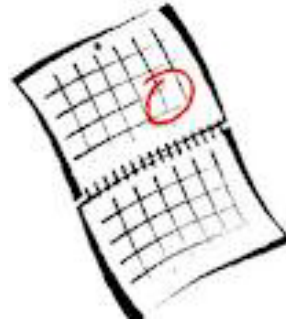

# Taking Back the American Dream

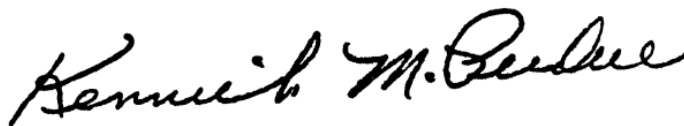
Collective bargaining is one way to help achieve the American Dream for working families and another way is through influencing public policies.

# *Legislative Issues Are Not in a Particular Order*



## *Resolution for Shared Prosperity*

Requesting the Joint Committee on Government and Finance to study the need for and proposing legislation promoting a shared prosperity from the development and recovery of natural gas reserves in underground shales and other geologic formations and establishing a Future Generations' Fund for the benefit of the general public welfare.

**WHEREAS**, West Virginia is blessed by an abundance of mineral resources, particularly coal, natural gas and oil; however, history has shown that while the State's mineral resources are a viable source of wealth, the value and benefits of such wealth diminishes with the depletion of these non-renewable resources to the detriment of present and future generations of West Virginians and their communities; and,

**WHEREAS**, the State's general revenues are often insufficient or unavailable to preserve or develop the State's infrastructure without an increase in the tax burden upon the citizens of West Virginia; and,

**WHEREAS**, as a result of technological advances in the development, drilling, recovery and transmission of the State's natural gas reserves, particularly in underground shale and other geologic formations, the State is presented with a prodigious opportunity to contemporaneously provide for the future well being of the Citizens of West Virginia; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Legislature finds it desirable to promote a shared prosperity for the Citizens of the State from its natural shale gas reserves by: creating job opportunities for resident West Virginians underwritten, in part, by tax incentives for employers hiring local workers;

increasing the Homestead Tax Exemption for resident West Virginians; reducing the real property tax of resident West Virginians; and establishing a "Future Generations Fund" for the benefit of the Citizens of West Virginia well into the future all to be funded by an enhanced severance tax on the extraction, development and transportation of the State's natural shale gas reserves while insuring a continuation of current tax revenue rates for counties, municipalities and education; and,

**RESOLVED** by the Legislature of West Virginia that the Joint Committee on Government and Finance is hereby directed to conduct a study of the need for and the benefits of creating job opportunities for local workers, increasing the Homestead tax exemption, reducing the real property tax of West Virginians and, the establishment of a Future Generations' Fund supported by an additional tax on the development, drilling, recovery and transmission of natural gas in underground shale and other geologic formations and maintained for the benefit of future generations of West Virginia apart from the general revenues of the State; and be it

**FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Joint Committee on Government and Finance report to the Legislature on the first day of the 2013 Regular Session on its findings, conclusions and recommendations together with drafts of any legislation to effectuate any recommendations.

**WV State Building Trades Resolution**  
**Marcellus Shale**

**Whereas**, the Marcellus Shale gas discovery is reported to be the largest natural gas field of the USA and perhaps the world; and

**Whereas**, Dominion Resources has chosen a contractor from Texas to build a \$500 million gas separation facility in Marshall County and denied any union contractors the opportunity to bid on the construction contract; and

**Whereas**, many local workers and contractors are not getting the construction job opportunities that are being created by the extraction and processing of this rich natural resource; and

**Whereas**, the State of West Virginia is actively seeking a company to build an ethane cracking plant that may cost in the range of \$2 billion to construct; and

**Whereas**, there are many unemployed workers affiliated with the West Virginia State Building Trades who have the skills needed to perform all aspects work related to harvesting and processing the Marcellus Shale gas;

**Therefore, be it Resolved**, that the West Virginia AFL-CIO promote legislation requiring all companies involved in Marcellus Shale drilling, pipeline, compression and processing and cracking facilities to use local workers.

When discussing Shale gas exploration in WV the Legislature must take into consideration surface owner's rights and environmental issues resulting from the exploration. Destruction of our roads and highways must also be considered.

**Buy West Virginia and America Act**

The WV AFL-CIO supports legislation that ensures state tax dollars are used to procure goods made in West Virginia and the United States when available.

**Protecting West Virginia Workers Act**

The WV AFL-CIO supports legislation that would fund and strengthen public employees' safety and health enforcement and provide workers with stronger job safety rights and protections as covered by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA).

**Job Export Disclosure Act**

The WV AFL-CIO supports legislation that will shine a light on companies that receive taxpayer dollars through state contracts or economic development assistance, reveal which companies are shipping jobs offshore and analyze the impact of outsourcing on the state's economy.

**Keep Good Jobs in the United States**

The WV AFL-CIO supports legislation to prevent outsourcing and privatizing of IT-related services. Most outsourced IT-services are performed by an overseas service provider.

### **Jobs, Trade and Democracy Act**

The WV AFL-CIO supports legislation that ensures state citizens and the state legislators they elect have access to information on the impact of international trade policy on the state's economy.

### **Study of Whistleblower Protections**

The Board of Coal Mine Health and Safety was directed to conduct a study of the need to expand protections for whistleblowers and other miners who refuse to work in situations they perceive as unsafe in underground mines.

The board was to study the benefits and appropriateness of requiring additional protections that will encourage miners to withdrawal from and report unsafe working conditions and investigate whether any pattern of retribution exists against these persons, and if so make recommendations to the Legislature by 12/31/11 regarding implementing additional protections.

The UMWA will follow up on the Board of Coal Mine Health and Safety study in the 2012 Legislative Session.

### **Paid Break / Rest Period**

The West Virginia AFL-CIO supports legislation to require a paid break following each four hour work period.

### **Mandatory Overtime**

Many employees, especially in the health care industry, are mandated to work overtime due to employers scheduling unreasonable amounts of overtime as a means of staffing and filling vacancies.

The West Virginia AFL-CIO supports legislation that would make overtime an option for workers to accept, not a mandatory requirement, unless there is an emergent, unforeseen circumstance.

### **Public Employee Collective Bargaining**

West Virginia is this country's only non-right-to-work state that does not afford some form of collective bargaining rights to public employees.

The West Virginia AFL-CIO shall serve notice to all elected officials that we speak with one voice saying, we shall not rest until this battle is won and we hereby call on Governor Tomblin to make 2012 the year West Virginia public employees obtain basic rights by endorsing and supporting passage of collective bargaining legislation designed to allow state employees the right to select an exclusive representative and negotiate over wages, benefits and working conditions; keeping current legislative protections in place until replaced by a collective bargaining agreement.

### **Increasing Pay for Public Employee**

The WV AFL-CIO supports pay increases for all public employees.

### **Increasing Salaries for Education Employees**

The WV AFL-CIO supports a compensation package for WV educators that will lift their salaries to the national average and a pay increase for all school service personnel.

### **Re-instating the Retiree Health care Subsidy for Newly Hired Public Employees**

The PEIA Finance Board adopted a policy that prevents public employees hired after June 30, 2010 from receiving any health care subsidy upon retirement.

The WV AFL-CIO will be an outspoken advocate, during the 2012 Legislative session, for the reinstatement of the retiree health care subsidy for newly hired public employees.

### **Increase in WV State Income Tax Exemption for Public Employees**

The WV AFL-CIO urges the West Virginia State Legislature to enact legislation to increase the exemption of retirement income for Public Employees from WV State income tax from the current amount of \$2,000 to \$20,000.

## **PEIA & OPEB**

The West Virginia AFL-CIO will be vigilant in watching the reform of PEIA due to changes created by the Affordable Care Act along with playing an active part in the passage of OPEB legislation.

## **Outsourcing of Jobs**

The West Virginia AFL-CIO and its affiliates call upon Governor Tomblin and the West Virginia Legislature to pass legislation that denies economic development assistance, tax abatements, and other forms of public support to businesses that ship jobs overseas and that Governor Tomblin be prohibited from agreeing to bind the state to any international trade agreements governing procurement without authorization from the state legislature.

## **Job Security**

To provide job security the West Virginia Legislature passed legislation during the 2007 legislative session extending civil service coverage to employees working at the West Virginia Regional Jails.

The West Virginia AFL-CIO will seek legislation to further extend civil service coverage to those state employees within the West Virginia Parkways and Economic Development Authority and the West Virginia Legislative employees to provide the same security to these public sector workers.

## **Equal Pay**

The West Virginia AFL-CIO calls upon Governor Tomblin and the Legislature to continue fully funding pay equity and that the Governor calls on the Executive departments in State Government to establish a coordinated planning process to correct gender based pay disparity among state employees.

## **Hatch Act Reform**

Public employees in West Virginia are denied the right to fully participate in the political process by not being allowed to run unrestricted for political office.

The West Virginia AFL-CIO hereby advocates the lifting of all restrictions that prevent public employees from running for political office or from participating fully in the political process.

## **Homestead Tax Exemption**

The State of West Virginia Tax Department offers a Homestead Tax Exemption Program that provides for a \$20,000 exemption against the total assessed value of a single family dwelling. This program has not had an increase in the tax exemption amount in over 20 years since its passage.

The West Virginia AFL-CIO will seek to reduce the burden of residents living on fixed incomes who qualify for this tax exemption by enacting legislation to increase the amount of the Homestead Tax Exemption Program.

## **Protecting Call Center Jobs**

WV tax dollars should not go to companies that off-shore US call center jobs overseas. This legislation would require the state to keep a list of all companies that have off-shored work. Those companies appearing on the list are ineligible for state funded grants or loans. The state would also have the ability to get back from the company any previous grants, loans or tax assistance that was provided. Also, any state contracts for call center work must be with call centers located in WV.

## **Respect on the Job for WV Alcohol Beverage Control Agency Enforcement Officers**

The WV AFL-CIO supports and joins with CWA in addressing safety issues, civil service coverage and pay equity for all WVABCA Enforcement Officers thru the W.Va. Legislature and any other avenues available to ensure they get the respect on the job they deserve.

### **Oppose Privatization of Public Services**

The West Virginia AFL-CIO will aggressively oppose privatization by educating elected officials and the general public about the problems related to privatization that will undermine the accountability in public programs.

The West Virginia AFL-CIO shall take appropriate strategies including legal action while supporting the passage of legislation restricting contracting out, in order to stop the privatizing of the delivery of public services.

### **Charter Schools**

Public schools should continue to be the base wherein research, innovation, and improvement of teaching and learning are centered.

Charter schools must not become a device for undermining public schools, for profit-making schemes, for privatization, for backdoor promotion of vouchers, for promoting an anti-public education and anti-government agenda and charter schools must not be used as a vehicle to promote racial, ethnic, ideological, economic or other segregated types of schools nor should they be vehicles to siphon off high-performing able students from other public schools.

The WV AFL-CIO will oppose legislation to establish charter schools in which employee rights are diminished, working conditions are aggravated and compensation packages fall below the national average.

### **WV State Police Manpower Shortage**

The West Virginia AFL-CIO will work for legislation to increase the number of Troopers with the West Virginia State Police to be no less than 800 to ensure the safety of our citizens and will seek passage of legislation to fully fund the increase in manpower.

### **Providing On-Call Compensation to Members of the WV State Police**

The West Virginia AFL-CIO supports legislation that will provide appropriate compensation to members of the West Virginia State Police required to remain on-call to provide law enforcement to the citizens of this State.

### **Increased Pay For Employees, Including The Starting Pay For Correctional Officers, Employed By The WV Division Of Corrections, WV Division Of Juvenile Services And The WV Regional Jails Authority**

West Virginia Correctional Employees perform some of the most hazardous and stressful work in the public sector and do so in dangerously overcrowded conditions. In addition, the alarmingly low starting pay for new Correctional Officers must be raised to recruit enough qualified candidates for this important work. Monies also be included in the Budget to fund approved step increases of the pay ranges within the Job Classifications.

### **20-Year Retirement Benefits for the WV Division of Corrections, WV Division of Juvenile Services and Regional Jail Employees**

The West Virginia AFL-CIO will seek passage of legislation to provide the West Virginia Division of Corrections, the West Virginia Division of Juvenile Services and the Regional Jail employees, after 20 years of service and age 55, full retirement benefits.

### **Incremental Salary Raises**

Revises W.Va. § 5-5-2, increasing incremental salary benefits (longevity) from \$60.00 to \$100.00 per year of service. Additionally, this bill removes the three-year waiting period to be eligible for the incremental increase. By eliminating the three-year waiting period, Public Employees with one year of service will be able to benefit from the annual increment pay.

### **Health Care Reform**

Many thought The Affordable Care Act legislation passed by Congress in 2010 should go much further and many thought it did too much but there was always broad agreement that our health care system was broken and reform was necessary.

The Affordable Care Act consists of many benefits that has made and will continue to make a positive difference in the lives of West Virginians, therefore, the West Virginia AFL-CIO and all of its’ affiliates stand ready to protect and if anything strengthen the legislation.

### **Re-authorization of No Child Left Behind**

The WV AFL-CIO shall not support the re-authorization of the No Child Left Behind Act, should it be revisited by Congress, unless measures are taken to ensure that our nation's most vulnerable students get the education they deserve.

### **Opposing Nationwide Do Not Mail Registry**

The West Virginia AFL-CIO goes on record opposing any action of the state legislature and/or the United States Congress to pass any resolution or legislation that would adopt a Do Not Mail Registry.

Establishing a “Do Not Mail” registry would be an extremely negative development for the continued employment of letter carriers, clerks, mailers and postal patrons alike.
